Bent Creek Campus of the Appalachian Forest Experiment Station (Boundary Decrease) Buncombe Co., N.C.

Summary

This amendment to the boundaries of the Bent Creek Campus of the Appalachian Forest Experiment Station (listed as a district in the National Register of Historic Places in 1993) documents a boundary decrease intended to remove a part of the district that did not retain its historic integrity at the time of listing. As originally defined, the district boundaries included an area on the north bank of Bent Creek that had been the site of a white pine experimental plot, an arboretum, an archery practice ground, and a base camp for unemployed men brought to the forest to cut fire wood, all uses that occurred during the period of significance (1925-1942). These uses had been wholly or largely discontinued by the end of the period of significance. The area has reverted to its natural forested appearance composed of mixed deciduous trees and undergrowth and further investigation has failed to locate visible above-ground evidence of the historic uses. Therefore the area has lost its historic integrity, justifying its removal from the district. The boundary decrease still provides the Bent Creek Campus with sufficient wooded setting, cited as contributing to the overall rustic effect of the district in the original nomination, and the decrease does not alter the original resource count. The area to be removed encompasses approximately 15 acres, reducing the total district area from approximately 35 acres to approximately 20 acres. The area to be removed is defined principally by a modern chain-link fence (which is excluded by the new boundaries) and includes part of an access road to the Blue Ridge Parkway and several unpaved forest roads.

This amendment provides: 1) new UTM references for the portion of the Bent Creek Campus that is to be excluded; 2) a new Verbal Boundary Description that describes the area to be excluded and relates it to the rest of the listed area; 3) a new Boundary Justification; 4) a map of the district at 1:200 scale that shows the area to be excluded; 5) a USGS map showing the area to be excluded; 6) photographs showing the area to be excluded; and 7) a photograph continuation sheet.

Verbal Boundary Description

The boundaries of the Bent Creek Campus of the Appalachian Forest Experiment Station remain the same as those described in the original nomination except for alterations to the south boundary and the southern end of the east and west boundaries. The original south boundary was defined by Bent Creek. The new south boundary is primarily defined by a modern fence that appears in photograph no. 9 (the fence is in the area to be removed from the district), and secondarily, near Highway 191, by an existing National Park Service boundary. A view showing the new boundary as seen from the pump house (inventory no. 1) appears as photograph no. 10. The original and new boundaries are portrayed on the accompanying map. The area to be excluded comprises the south end of the listed district.

Boundary Justification

The diminution of the boundaries of the Bent Creek Campus of the Appalachian Forest Experiment Station is intended to remove acreage that had lost its historic integrity at the time of listing. Like several of the district's existing boundaries, the new south boundary follows manmade features: a modern fence and a property line. The new boundaries preserve sufficient forested acreage around the Bent Creek Campus to maintain the natural character of the setting of the campus.
