The Hinton Rowan Helper House is a 1 1/2 story building with clapboarding over the original log house with modern frame additions. The house has a continual shed dormer at the front and a lean-to rear extension. The roof overhangs the front porch and is supported on four posts. The interior chimney was originally outside on the east wall, but now indicates the point from which the east addition was made to the houses enlarging it by one-third. The rear lean-to was further extended recently by the addition of a modern kitchen.

On the first floor the original house unit consists of the two rooms at the front and one room (dining room) to the rear of these. The modern additions are the kitchen at the rear which runs the full 30' width of the house and two rooms at the east end of the structure, one off the dining room, the other off the front parlor. The straight staircase rises along the west wall of the parlor into a central bedroom on the secong floor. Two end bedrooms flank the central bedroom.

The contemporary appearance of the building is deceiving. Under the asphalt shingling, the newly painted clapboard, and the shed dormer, is the original Helper House. The old weatherboarding was removed, and additions made. However, the log supports (some hewn square, others natural) are still intact as are the wide floorboards and split log thresholds. The front door enters into the front parlor, the only place where the square-timber walls with plaster chinking are exposed. The fireplace and original mantel is on the east wall. The rafters and sheathing are still intact.

8. Significance: (1) Hinto R. Helper House

It was here at the house near Mocksville where Helper spent the first 20 years of his life observing the conflict of free labor and the slave system. After a time in the California gold fields, about which he wrote his first tract, Land of Gold, he returned to North Carolina preparing his fateful work, dividing his time between the Mocksville house and another at nearby Salisbury which no longer exists.

Biography

Helper was born in 1829 in the vicinity of Mocksville, North Carolina and graduated from the Mocksville Academy in 1848. For a short time he worked in a local store but in 1850 he shipped out of New York City around Cape Horn to the gold fields of California. Three years later he returned east and in 1855 wrote The Land of Gold based upon his experiences at the gold mines.

The following year he wrote the <u>Impending Crisis</u>, his influential brief in behalf of the non-slaveholding whites of the south. Contrasting the economic condition of the free and slave states, he attributed the backwardness of the South to the impoverishment of free labor by slavery. The tract contained no sympathy for the Black man but solely for the poor laborer who could not compete with the dominant system. He attacked slaveholders violently, even calling for a slave uprising, if necessary, to overthrow the system. The book caused a sensation far greater than <u>Uncle Tom's Cabin</u>. Reaction to it was so furious that Helper took refuge in New York City while his work was publicly burned, those who trafficked in or possessed it were jailed, and his sympathizers lost their jobs and privileges.

Republicans, jubilant over such damning testimony out of the mouth of a Southern witness, printed 100,000 copies of Helper's work and distributed it widely during the 1860 campaign. It was instrumental in swelling the ranks of the Republican elctorate. The heat that it aroused was a powerful contributing cause of the Civil War.

During the Civil War, Lincoln appointed Helper consul at Buenos Aires where he served until 1866. He retuned to the United States and wrote three volumes during the years 1867 to 1871. All three were virulent denunciations of congressional reconstruction and its theories of negro equality.

After resigning the consulship he acted as attorney for citizens having claims against South American governments and interested himself in many phases of South American activities—canal construction, steamship communication, the commercial marine, and the involvement of the U.S. Navy in South American affairs.



Gradually he reduced his activity to a venture which occupied him, some say, to the point of madness--promotion of a railroad from the Hudson Bay to the Strait of Magellan. The project bankrupted him. He became despondent and bitter. Finally, in 1909 in Washington, D.C., he took his own life and was buried by strangers.
