The cemetery contains about 300 markers, approximately 25 of which are locally made. The earliest inscribed marker is dated 1839. Spring Hill has no examples of the dominant schools of stonecutting in the county. The following seven most significant gravestones reflect echoes of the Pierced Tradition or belong to the humble decorative tradition followed by amateur stonecutters in the county:

One of the oldest Methodist Protestant churches in the county, Spring Hill Methodist Protestant Church was established in $1830.^{1}$



CRITERIA ASSESSMENT

A,C Derives primary significance from the unique collection of folk gravestones by local stonecutters erected here in the late eighteenth and first half of the nineteenth centuries. These highly decorative soapstone gravestones with folk symbols for resurrection and eternity represent the height of folk art accomplishment within the craft community of the Anglo-German farmers of north Davidson County.

Contains a small group of locally-manufactured gravestones dating from the 1840s which represent the debased echo of the "Pierced Style" which flourished in the previous two decades in the German Lutheran communities of north Davidson County.
