RE: Replace Bridge No. 104 on NC 104 over Broad Creek, Beaufort County, North Carolina, TIP # B-4018, ER 04-0102

Thank you for your letter of February 3, 2005 regarding the State Historic Preservation Office's determination that the Candy-Alligood farm is considered to be eligible for the National Register of Historic Places.

In accordance with this determination, the proposed National Register boundary should consist of the entire 102.5-acre tax parcel associated with the farmhouse. This parcel represents the portion of Alligood lands south of Broad Creek that were conveyed to Anna Alligood Gray from her father, Hilton Alligood. The boundary contains the farmhouse and outbuildings, the Spruill gravesite, cultivated fields, and woodlands lying on the south side of Broad Creek that are associated with the original farm acreage. The property contained within the boundary possesses sufficient integrity to represent the historic agricultural character of the farm.

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
