Thank you for your recent comments on the above report. We are pleased that you concur with our recommendations that the Frank Lambert House (GF1808) is eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places and the Rudd-Gordon House (GF9099), Hopkins-Gordon House (GF1810), Gordon House (GF1809), Lambeth Smith (GF9100), McKinney-Smothers Farm (GF1807), and the Monticello Rural Historic District (GF9102) fail to meet the criteria. I assume that the Rudd-Parks House (GF9101), also recommended in the report as not National Register eligible, was inadvertently omitted from the list in your memo. The Frank Lambert House will be the subject of discussion at an upcoming effects consultation.

The attached map illustrates the proposed National Register boundary for the Frank Lambert House, incorporating your suggestion of extending it to include all of the tree line to the west and north of the associated barn.
