Dear Mr. Knott:

Based on our telephone conversation the other day, it is my understanding that you are currently satisfied with the design revisions we shared with you showing the changes in the interchange design for the US 64 Bypass (project R-2547). These changes (copy attached) show a reduction in the size of the US 64 Business to US 64 Bypass loop and the relocation of the US 64 westbound to existing US 64 ramp to the southeast corner of your property. Importantly, the changes spare the house and the out buildings from any direct impacts. While this does show the taking of a small portion of your property, the Roadway Design Branch has agreed to carefully examine this in final design to see if the impacts can be further reduced.

It is also my understanding that based on these proposed changes you have agreed to drop the request for the reevaluation of your property under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act. Of course, you reserve the right to once again request the reevaluation should the final design plans show impacts greater than those shown on the attached sketch.

If this is different from your understanding of our current situation, please let me know as soon as possible.



Dear Mr. and Mrs. Knott:

Thank you for your letter of May 21, 1997, requesting a reevaluation of the National Register eligibility of your property, the Smith-Collie-Robertson-Knott Plantation House, and expressing concern about the potential impacts of the above project on it.

Because the project involves funds from the Federal Highway Administration (FHwA), it is subject to compliance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act. Section 106 requires consideration of National Register-listed or eligible properties that may be affected by federal projects. In 1994, your property was evaluated for National Register eligibility on behalf of FHwA by the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT). The FHwA determined that the property is not eligible for the National Register, and we concurred with their finding.

However, since you have provided additional information about the history and architecture of the property, we believe a reevaluation may be warranted. By copy of this letter, we are providing your request for a reevaluation and photographs to the FHwA for their consideration and handling under the applicable federal regulations.

The above comments are made pursuant to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act and the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation's Regulations for Compliance with Section 106 codified at 36 CFR Part 800.
